

Fr. George Clements to Speak on Behalf of Rural Village Children in Nigeria

CHICAGO, September 4, 2017 – On **October 4th**, 2017 **Home to Enhance African Life** (HEAL) will host its **4th Annual Benefit** at the Franciscans of the Holy Family Custody in Kenwood from 6-9pm. In view of the spirituality and mission of HEAL, the event will highlight the educational challenges facing poor and marginalized orphans and rural village children in southeast Nigeria.

Such challenges affecting youth development are not unique to Nigeria, but have also defined the ministry of a legendary priest in Chicago, **Fr. George Clements**. At his residence in Evergreen Park, Fr. Clements recently met with HEAL Founder, **Deacon Leonard Okonkwo**. The clerics shared their life stories of service to the least of God's people (Mt. 25: 40) and discovered a spiritual bond.

Fr. Clements agreed to speak on October 4th on behalf of the 300 children HEAL educates in three rural village K-12 schools. The main challenge to rural education in Nigeria is the inability of parents to pay school fees. As subsistence farmers, they do not have the income necessary to sustain a school in their villages. But, HEAL is committed to people in these very areas, where education is the only hope for children who are otherwise extremely at risk.

This commitment to rural education reflects the **self-emptying spirituality** which motivates all HEAL's missionary efforts. Jesus emptied Himself and left behind His Divine glory and majesty to become human and save us (Phil 2:6-11). Because Fr. Clements demonstrated this spiritual quality in his life, Rev. Leo will honor him with the "Kenosis Award" for self-emptying service.
